

## NATIONAL APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAMME

"The Route for a Successful Career"











## 1.0 THE NATIONAL APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAMME

It is a mode of pre-employment training, which combines On-the-Job Training in enterprises and Off-the-Job Learning MITD training centres. It develops the necessary skills, knowledge and behaviours required of a trade providing Apprentices with a recognized qualification leading to National Certification.



#### 2.0 APPRENTICESHIP TRAINING

- 80% learning in enterprises
- 20% learning in MITD training centres.

The Apprentice attends theory and practical training where they are taught the technical knowledge and the skills at the training centre. At the work place, the Apprentice applies the knowledge and skills learned under the supervision of a trained and qualified Supervisor who instructs, guides and oversees the Apprentice's work.

## 3.0 WHO WILL BENEFIT FROM THE APPRENTICESHIP TRAINING?

16 years old and above (depending on the trade)

## 4.0 RESPONSIBILITY OF THE EMPLOYER, APPRENTICE AND THE MITD

#### The Employer

- Has to be registered with the MITD to dispense training under apprenticeship.
- Signs a Deed of Contract with the Apprentice or his legal guardian.
- Supports and trains the Apprentice according to the curriculum prescribed by the MITD.
- Ensures appropriate supervision of the Apprentice at the workplace.
- Has to release the Apprentice to attend Centre-Based Learning and other related training activities at MITD Training Centres.
- Provides the Apprentice with training and requisites for such training, free of cost (including safety and health apparels, uniform (where applicable) and others as applicable.
- Has to ensure a safe working environment for the Apprentice.
- Has to submit on time all documents including monthly attendance sheets of apprentices for payment of stipend.

#### The Apprentice

- Has to be punctual and regular at both the Centre and work place.
- Has to fill in his logbook regularly and get it duly signed by the Supervisor.
- Has to abide by the rules and regulations both at MITD Training Centres and at the Employer's place.
- Has to take all the course assessments at both the Centre and the workplace.
- Has to be professional, ethical and maintain confidentiality in all dealings.



#### The MITD

- Carries out survey for availability of training places in industry.
- Undertakes to get the contract between the Employer and the Apprentice signed.
- Delivers Centre-Based Learning.
- Conducts regular visits to monitor training in industry.
- Trains Supervisors of the industry in pedagogical skills for coaching the Apprentices.
- Ensures the conduct of examination through the Mauritius Examinations Syndicate and MITD.



## 5.0 THE DEED OF APPRENTICESHIP CONTRACT

The Contract is regulated by the IVT Regulations 1994 and the MITD Act 2009. It is a legal document on which the mutual agreement for On - the - Job Training and Off - the - Job Learning is made between the Employer and the Apprentice or his legal guardian (for Apprentice under 18). The contract is then registered with the MITD.



#### 6.0 EMPLOYER REGISTRATION

Employers joining the NAP are invited to make an application to the MITD. On receiving the request, MITD Officers assess the eligibility of the Employer (in terms of equipment, licenses and experience of personnel) to deliver training as per the curriculum. Upon satisfaction of the criteria, a Certificate of Registration is issued to the Employer to allow the latter to deliver On - the - Job Training to the apprentice. The certificate of registration is valid for a period of 2 years and renewable subject to satisfaction of all criteria.

#### 7.0 FINANCIAL INCENTIVE

Under the Budget 2018-2019, the Human Resource Development Council provides the financial incentive of a monthly stipend of Rs 5,000 and a travelling allowance of Rs 1,000 to an Apprentice.

#### 8.0 **CERTIFICATION AND ARTICULATION**

Courses are offered at National Certificate (NC) levels 3 & 4.






